- There was some discussion about estate planning and the need to have wills and medical directives in place. One of the members brought up the Lady Bird Trust, which is a legal device in Florida to name your heirs as beneficiaries and avoid your estate going into probate. Naming beneficiaries, or having someone on your bank accounts, means the funds will go directly to those people, and will not have to be probated. Likewise for your home. You may want to consider naming a beneficiary or having someone on the deed with you. If you think this could be beneficial to you, please research this and/or contact your attorney. And be sure you fully trust the person you name as beneficiary or co-owner. You don't have to have a lot of money to take advantage of this option. If you are currently using any property tax exemptions, please be sure that what you do will not adversely affect these benefits.
- Another member questioned if any of us has received a check in the spouse's name long after death. If you have taken your spouse's name off your bank account, you will probably not be able to cash or deposit any checks in their name. Please consider this before removing their name from any accounts. You can leave their name on the account but print checks and deposit tickets with only your name if you desire.
